C.U.P.E. Local 459 is pleased to offer at least two annual bursaries of a minimum \$500.00. To apply for these bursaries you must be planning to attend a recognized institution of advanced education or career training program. This would include apprenticeship programs.

THE BURSARY

Each bursary will be awarded for:

- tuition or fees and the purchase of books, tools, or supplies needed to pursue studies or training in an apprenticeship, trade, or career program
- tuition toward instruction at a recognized institution of advanced education or training.

Following proof of the above, the amount will be paid directly to the recipient with the understanding that if the student withdraws from the program, the bursary monies will be returned to C.U.P.E. Local 459. The bursary must be used within 24 months of being awarded.

ELIGIBILITY

In order to qualify for the scholarship, the applicant must:

- ◆ be a graduating student of any Sooke School District secondary school or a secondary school graduating student who is a dependent of a member of CUPE Local 459 (please ensure you include the name on the first page of the application).
(Special consideration may be given to applicants who are dependents of CUPE 459 members and/or with need of financial assistance)

APPLICATION

The application form **must** be accompanied by:

- (a) a letter outlining plans for post-secondary education or training (i.e.: university, college, apprenticeship, etc.).
- (b) a resume that describes you. This should include your achievements in academics, athletics and the arts as well as any hobbies or special interests
- (c) one letter of reference from your current school
- (d) one letter of reference from a community member in support of your volunteer work
- (e) a record of marks for grade 10 and 11, and current grade 12 marks

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
